Vinyl to CD

Efficient Audio Transfer

Presented by Mike Ostrowe

Do you have stacks of LPs and boxes of cassette tapes that you would like to transfer to CDs or DVDs...or to an iPod, Zen, or other MP3 player? You may have great symphonies, or recordings by a European orchestra, Pavarotti, funky jazz, bouncy Beatles, or classic rock. You paid for all those LPs, and saved them for years—why not transfer your old media to new media?

Outside conversion services are expensive and hard to find, and many records or tapes are not available on CDs or via downloads. It is really not that hard, nor that expensive, to convert your old media to new media...you can do it yourself. Not only that, but the end product may be considerably improved.

It is often possible to remove pops from records and hiss from tapes. You can rebalance the sound, perhaps adding bass and diminishing treble, or making



modifications to some of each to suit your personal taste.

No turntable? No problem! Our presenter Mike Ostrowe will show how to use a new, inexpensive turntable with a USB connection. Just plug this into your computer, use software like Roxio's CD Creator, and you are set to go. [I have a lot of LP's and a working turntable, but my music system is not located near my computer, so this turntable is a practical solution.]

Editor's note: This meeting will not deal with copyright issues: the legality of transferring music from a vinyl recording you own to a new medium...just so that you can continue to enjoy what you purchased. (See below for some resources in this complex area.)

Please note that this is a very complex topic, with many, varied interpretations. In general, audio transfer for private, home use should not be a problem. However, the music industry has been growing more aggressive in trying to prevent all types of copying. These references cast light on the issue.

Preserve Your Rights: The Orphan Works Issue

Photographers—and other artists—should be aware of the Orphan Works issue, involving ownership and use of creative works whose owners or creators cannot be located. Because photos and illustrations are frequently published without attribution, they may easily fall into the category of "Orphan Works." In 2006, there was an attempt in Congress to pass legislation making it easier for entities to use such work freely—and harder for photographers and designers to regain their rights. After the 2006 elections this legislation was tabled.

However, to protect future rights, individuals should endeavor to ensure that their names are attached to their works, both in print and online.

Open Office is an office suite which is free for the downloading. The suite includes word processor, spreadsheet, presentation generator, and drawing application. Testers particularly like the integration among the suite's applications, such as being able to create new spreadsheet applications from within the word processor. It is able to import from and export to such familiar file formats as .doc and .xls. Available in both Windows and Linux versions, it is written in open code, with a community of contributors.
